# LA CRETE AGRICULTURAL SOCIETY 2021 LA CRETE FALL FAIR 

The objectives of the La Crete Agricultural Society in the organization of the Fall Fair are:

- To support and promote horticultural education, home economics, culinary skills, photography, writing, collections, art, woodworking, hand crafts, etc...
- To give recognition to outstanding contributions and achievements in the above areas.
- We are giving out prizes for certain special categories. Look for them in the book.
- The Fall Fair bench show is planned for August 21, 2021, and we really wish to encourage more horticultural entries. Pioneer Day will be a separate event in early September.


## RULES \& REGULATIONS

1. Each exhibitor must register with the La Crete Agricultural Society by filling out the registration form in the back of this booklet. Fill the form and tags out in advance and bring them in with your exhibits when you bring the items to the La Crete Heritage Centre. Books and tags will be available at La Crete Co-op and Super J starting August 1, 2021.
Drop off time is 9:00-6:00 on August 19 \& 20, 2021.
2. Each entry must have been grown or made by exhibitor and not previously entered in any La Crete Fall Fair.
3. Entries must be limited to one item per category. Example: You may enter one photo of scenery, one of wild animals, one of tame animals, one of still life, one of birds, etc... See categories listed in booklet.
4. Entries must be clean and as free of insects and disease as possible.
5. Volunteers will be available to help during registration.
6. The Society will not be responsible for the loss or damage to the exhibits. We will, however, exercise the greatest care possible.
7. The horticulture will be judged based on Alberta Horticultural Association exhibiting standards.
8. The display area must be free of exhibitors during judging (the morning of August 21, 2021). The show will open to the public at 1:00 p.m. on August 21, 2021 and close at 5:00 p.m.
9. The decisions of the judges are final.
10. $1^{\text {st }}, 2^{\text {nd }}, 3^{\text {rd }}$ Ribbons will be awarded on the day of the show.

## 11. Prizes:

- $\$ 1$ prize per ribbon point!!! First prize ribbons get three points; second prize ribbons get two points, and third prize ribbons get one point.
This could be substantial for those that bring in lots of quality items.
- Special 2021 features! Watch for the special 2021 features within the listed categories that could result in additional prize money. See highlighted categories.

12. Exhibits are to be picked up between 5:00 and 6:00 p.m. on August 21, 2021. If exhibits are removed prior to 5:00 p.m., awards will be forfeited.
13. Some vegetables can be entered in three different ways:

- Best in uniformity and color
- Biggest
- Most unique

Check the categories carefully to see which category you want to enter your vegetables. For example: You could enter your best-looking pumpkin in one category, your biggest pumpkin in another, and the funniest looking one in yet another. If a category does not specify BIGGEST or MOST UNIQUE, it is "Best in uniformity and color".
14. If there is an article you wish to exhibit, but find no category in which to place it, bring the article for display. If enough similar works are entered, we will create a new category.
15. There are some separate categories for children in the "Junior Classes" section. But children are also welcome to enter exhibits in any of the adult categories.

## FRESH CUT FLOWERS: Note:

1. Must be outdoor grown and free of insects and diseases
2. Cut flowers in the late afternoon when food reserves are at the highest.
3. Remove foliage unless otherwise stated.
4. Place them in enough lukewarm water to sustain them throughout the Fall Fair.
5. Sugar can be added to water to help sustain them throughout the Fall Fair
6. Quality is as important as the size of the flower
7. Cut flowers with short fragile stems need to be in a small plastic container (like a margarine or chip dip container). Fill it with enough water so the stem will be able to reach it at all times. Cover the top with foil paper. Cut out the centre of the lid and use the lid rim to put over the foil. Carefully poke holes through the foil to stick the stems into.
8. Tall flowers like lilies, poppies, gladiolas, etc... should be in tall clear glass vases suitable for the size of the stems.
9. Roses: The bloom can be cut the day before the show to allow for hardening. The best time to do this is either early morning or late evening. With a sharp cutting tool cut the stem at an angle above an outward facing bud. Immediately place the stem into a container of warm water. Remove submerged foliage. Store flowers in a cool room.
